The Old Berwick Historical Society promotes public awareness of and appreciation for local and regional history through a variety of activities that explore, preserve, interpret, and celebrate the past, and through stewardship of the Counting House Museum and its collections. The Society operates the Counting House Museum at 2 Liberty Street in South Berwick, which is open Saturdays and Sundays, 1-4 p.m., late June through early October, or year round by appointment.

The Society's website includes extensive historical information taken from local histories, including information about the Scottish prisoners of war who worked at the early mills in the community.
