



Peter Flewelling

I want to tell you a bit about Peter Flewelling and his contributions to the Micum McIntire Clan.

He was a member of the Clan Council from 1973-76. (During this time, he was one of the signers of our Incorporation papers.) He was president from 1976-78. After that time, he worked for many years with the Program Committee, helping to come up with interesting programs for each year's Reunions. He was then on the Council again from 2018-2020.

When I asked Peter how he first got involved with the Clan, he said that it was really because of his mother, Evelyn Eliza McIntire Flewelling, an English teacher at Washburn High School. She discovered a genealogy of her immediate McIntire family written by Florence Wyman of Abington, Massachusetts. Through this book she learned of Micum and his eventual settlement in York, the McIntire Garrison and the Micum McIntire Clan.

Sometime after that, in the 1950s, the whole family drove to York and to the Garrison where they were met by Alice McIntire, who gave them a tour of the building. After that trip the family became Clan members and started trekking from Perham to York for the annual Reunions.

Over the years, Peter has contributed much in many areas. Thank you, for your years of active service and for helping to make the Clan what it is today.
